
### **UConn Honors**

# UConn Honors Awards and Requirements

Our students may earn two awards upon graduation. Honors Scholar in the Major recognizes depth and creativity in their field. University Honors Laureate is awarded to Honors Scholars who demonstrate additional breadth and leadership inside and outside the classroom.

- 3 from any course at any level
